### Georgia Entrepreneurial Facts

- There are 724,665 registered establishments in Georgia (SOS: 3/2/15)
- According to the GA Dept. of Labor, 281,554 business establishments represented GA employment in the second quarter of 2014; of those:
  - 99.8% are categorized as small (fewer than 500 employees)
  - 97.6% employed fewer than 100
  - 94.6% employed fewer than 50
  - 77.5% employed fewer than 10
  - \*\*\*Georgia Ranks #1 for Entrepreneurship in numerous publications

#### Entrepreneurs vs. Small Business Owners



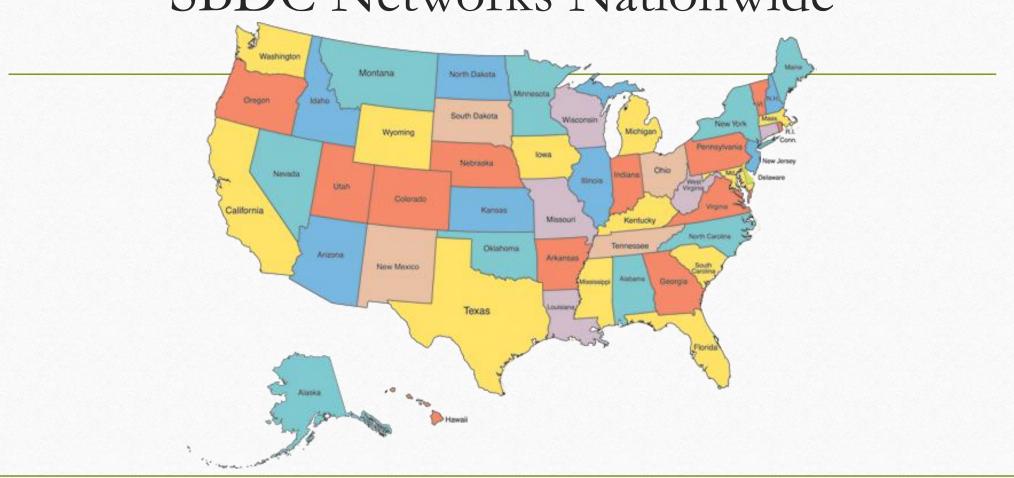

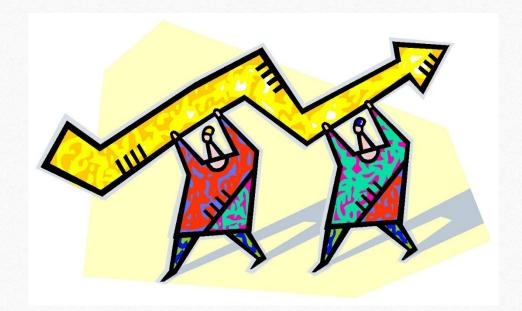
